The KTEL Class that I received would have been a great help during high school and early on in college. Only after taking this class did many of my shortcomings come to light.

During my Electrical Apprenticeship the work schedule was 12 hours a day 7 days a week. Added to this was a full time academic schedule at college needed to complete several apprenticeship required courses. The pace was grueling and without the skills I had learned in KTEL there would not have been enough hours in the day. My necessary study time was reduced and my retention of the data was increased immensely.

I have taught both of my sons at an early age the techniques that I learned. One son has ADHD, and a common problem is a lack of attention. For a child with ADHD to stay on task is a challenge. By the use of task lists they have helped his efficiency. Lists like current, future or to be started and linking and organizing notes help take everything to a successful completion.

One thing learned from the course was to also be a good instructor, always defining key words, not skipping steps and always finding out "what was the last step that you understood" plus providing similar examples has taken my sons to the top of their graduating classes. I'm convinced that this class has enriched my life as well as my sons and they will use these techniques as they enter college.

I would strongly encourage everyone to take this class at any stage of your life and pass on the wealth of knowledge presented.
